We are a collaborative community outreach initiative comprised of Winston's Wish Foundation, South Carolina Department of Disabilities and Special Needs and the USC School of Medicine Center for Disability Resources.

We are here to help your child get the most out of their home-based Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)/ Early Intensive Behavior Intervention (EIBI) program. We hope that you and your consultant will carefully consider all the items we offer and choose what best meets your child's individual needs. Should your child require an item that is not listed on our index sheet, your Consultant or ABA/EIBI Provider may contact us directly to make a special request. We will do our very best to meet the needs of all children who match the criteria for the program.

Once your BCBA or ABA/EIBI provider completes the application, your service coordinator will submit the request to the USC School of Medicine Center for Disability Resources on behalf of your child. Your paperwork will be processed, your order will be filled and available requested items will be sent directly to your home. You must wait until your Lead Therapist or your Consultant is present to open the box, as it will be their responsibility to check the inventory inside to make sure the order was filled correctly and everything arrived in tact. If the box is opened and items are used before your Lead Therapist takes an inventory of the contents, you will risk termination from the program. Items may be returned to the Teaching Toy Box through your Service Coordinator at the appropriate time.

Policies & Procedures

The Teaching Toy Box is a collaborative community outreach initiative comprised of Winston's Wish Foundation, the SC Department of Disabilities and Special Needs and the USC School of Medicine Center for Disability Resources.

The purpose of this initiative is to provide additional support to children engaged in home-based ABA programs. We offer materials and items prescribed by Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBA) and certified EIBI Consultants. Children must be under the care of a BCBA or a EIBI Consultant and actively participating in a home-based Applied Behavior Analysis program in order to apply.

BCBAs and EIBI Consultants can submit an application on behalf of a child in which they may request up to 5 items every six months, not to exceed 10 items per year. The BCBA/EIBI Consultant must make their requests based on the current programming needs of the child.

Once an application has been submitted, in-stock items will be mailed directly to the family. Some items may be drop-shipped to the family. The Lead Therapist will be required to open and check in all materials. If the box(es) have been opened prior to the Lead Therapist's arrival, the family will risk termination from the program. The Lead Therapist will submit the check in sheet to the child's Service Coordinator. Any problems with items sent must be immediately reported to USC School of Medicine Center for Disability Resources.

If a child has mastered a program which required materials from the Teaching Toy Box, and those items are still in excellent condition, we would appreciate the family returning the item so that another child might have the same opportunity for growth. Your service coordinator will arrange for pick up of items no longer needed.

All participants must sign the application. The application will not be considered unless all parties have signed in the appropriate space. Applications will not be returned for missing signatures. The BCBA/EIBI consultant must reapply. There will be no exceptions.

Teaching Toy Box requests will be filled by rolling application beginning December 6, 2010.

Use of all items listed and not listed but provided by special request should be done so under the supervision of the child's BCBA/EIBI Consultant. The parent will assume full responsibility for any and all liability resulting from the use of the items provided through this program.

Participants must sign and return this sheet along with the Policy Sheet. I agree to use these items as prescribed by my Behavior Analyst. I understand these items are to aide my child in his/her home-based ABA therapy program. My BCBA/EIBI Consultant will apply to the Teaching Toy Box on my child's behalf. A request will be made for items which are relevant to my child's current ABA home-based program and will enhance his/her treatment. After all paperwork is submitted by my Service Coordinator, items in stock will be sent to my home address. I understand that I must wait for my Lead Therapist to open the box and check the inventory. Some items may be sent directly to my home from a supplier or manufacturer. If I decide to terminate my child's home-based ABA program, I will contact my Early Interventionist/Service Coordinator and return all items. I understand that my child's home-based ABA program must be supervised by a Board Certified Behavior Analyst/EIBI Consultant in order to participate in the Teaching Toy Box. I have read and understand the policies of the Teaching Toy Box and agree to adhere to all stipulations and requirements.
